

**DR. ROBERT GEORGE, PROFESSOR AT PRINCETON UNIVERSITY,
JOINS BOARD OF THE RENEWAL FORUM**

Robert P. George has agreed to become a member of the Board of Directors of the Renewal Forum. Dr. George is the McCormick Professor of Jurisprudence, a Professor of Politics and an associated faculty member of the Department of Philosophy at Princeton University. He is also the Founder and Director of the University's James Madison Program in American Ideals and Institutions.

Commenting on his election, Renewal Forum President Steven Wagner said, "In addition to his remarkably accomplished academic career, Dr. George is a tireless advocate for the advancement of human dignity. He continues to fight for the protection of vulnerable persons – in particular the victims of labor and sex exploitation – and he is an outspoken critic of those aspects of our society which facilitate this exploitation. The Renewal Forum is deeply honored and gratified that a person of Dr. George's intellectual firepower and insight has agreed to join our organization, and we look forward to working with him in the cause of abolishing modern-day slavery in the United States."

Dr. George is a member of the President's Council on Bioethics, and former member of the United States Commission on Civil Rights. In addition to his academic work, he is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations and serves as Of Counsel to the law firm of Robinson and McElwee.

A graduate of the Harvard Law School, Dr. George received his doctorate in philosophy of law from Oxford University. He holds honorary doctorates of law, letters, ethics, humane letters, civil law, and science. He is the author of six books and the editor of four. His numerous articles have appeared in periodicals such as the New York Times, the Wall Street Journal, the Washington Post, First Things, Touchstone, the Boston Review, City Journal, National Review, and the Times Literary Supplement.
